


BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This two day workshop discusses the theoretical and practical aspects of wound ballistics; the discussions are led by various experts. There are also live demonstrations, under laboratory conditions, of a variety of projectiles being shot into internationally accepted tissue simulants (no animals are used). The workshop is designed to give an essential understanding of the subject, mainly to three professions:

- Health professionals, especially trauma surgeons;
- Pathologists;
- Forensic specialists;
- Lawyers specialising in international humanitarian law and human rights law;
- Law enforcement shooting instructors.



Third day

- Forensic applications and more...




The main language during the Workshop is English
