Firearms Examiner

As a Firearms Examiner for CSPD's (Colorado Springs Police Department) Metro Crime Lab, you will perform firearm and tool mark examinations, prepare technical reports that support analytical findings, and present them in a court of law through expert witness testimony.

This is a grant-funded position with funding through September 2022 and the possibility of an extension.

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Essential Job Functions - the basic job duties an employee must be able to perform:

- Perform mechanically functioning examinations of a wide variety of handguns, rifles, and shotguns
- Identify and analyze firearms and related physical evidence, including bullets, cartridge cases, shotshells, wadding, and live ammunition
- Test-fire firearms; submit bullets and cartridge cases to Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) or CSPD for National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN) entry, and match confirmations
- Compare test fire bullets and cartridge cases to specimens gathered at crime scenes
- Determine if the standards and evidentiary materials came from the same firearm
- Perform firearm proximity tests
- Identify brand and model firearms

- Prepare test tool marks and compare to evidence gathered at crime scenes
- Prepare technical reports that support analytical findings
- Prepare reports to present in court; serve as an expert witness
- Provide training for law enforcement academies, officers, and attorneys in the firearms discipline

We are looking for candidates who demonstrate:

- Knowledge of operations, services, and activities of a crime lab
- Knowledge of legal procedures for the admission of evidence in criminal investigations
- Knowledge of equipment, materials, and supplies used in a crime lab
- Knowledge of pertinent federal, state, and local laws, codes, and regulations
- Ability to work under stressful conditions
- Ability to stay abreast of current technologies and procedures
- Ability to testify in court proceedings as an expert witness
- Ability to communicate clearly and concisely, orally and in writing
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships

This position requires the ability to work independently and exceptional organizational skills.

SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATE WILL HAVE:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with major coursework in general chemistry, analytical chemistry, physical chemistry, biology, microbiology, criminology, or other forensic related science field
- Three years of full-time forensic laboratory experience to include experience specific to firearm and tool mark examinations, including experience as an expert witness
- Possess and maintain a valid, non-probationary Colorado driver's license not subject to restriction related to alcohol and/or drug violations or pending charges

IDEAL CANDIDATES WILL ALSO HAVE:

- Experience working in an ISO-17025 Accredited Laboratory
- IBIS/NIBIN training and experience
- The following AFTE (Association of Firearm and ToolMark Examiners) certifications:
 - (FA-AFTE) Certification in Firearms Evidence Examination and Identification;
 - (GSR-AFTE) Gunshot Residue Evidence Examination and Identification; and/or
 - (TM-AFTE) Toolmark Evidence Examination and Identification

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

This position requires the ability to respond to crime scene locations.

The job offer will be contingent upon successful completion of a polygraph examination, extensive background check, and other pre-employment assessments.
